The Consortium would like to express our sincere thanks to the management committee of Langleydale School Community Centre which has recently closed. The centre was a school until the late 1970's when it was taken over by the committee and reopened as a community centre which regularly held dances and was the base for Barnard Castle Young Farmers.

The centre has closed as the current committee, many of whom have been involved since the start of the community centre, felt it was time to stand down and unfortunately despite a public meeting earlier this year a new committee could not be formed.

We would like to thank the committee for their support of the Consortium over the years and wish them all the best for the future.

Future Teesdale Village Halls Consortium Training Opportunities

In April the Consortium was successful in gaining funding through the Neighbourhood Learning for Deprived Communities Fund (NLDC) to run four training courses: Award in Food Safety, Award in Health and Safety, Moving and Handling Principles and Emergency First Aid for Appointed Persons. These courses are running over the next few weeks and we have had a great response to the publicity for them with the courses getting filled up quickly.

We are planning to apply for more funding to run further courses in the autumn; the proposed courses are:

- Award in Food Safety in Catering
- Award in Health and Safety
- Emergency First Aid for Appointed Persons
- Early Years First Aid (for those working with children)
- Fire Marshal
- Risk Assessment
- Moving and Handling Principles

Area Action Partnership Launch Event – Summary

The official launch meeting of the Teesdale Area Action Partnership (AAP) was held on 22nd April. 127 people attended the launch and due to demand a second event was held on 30th April which was attended by a further 11 people. One of the main aims of the first meeting was to choose the name for the AAP and in a vote on the night Teesdale Action Partnership came out as the final choice. Another aim for the meeting was to develop five priority themes for the AAP to focus on over the coming year. There were many issues discussed on the night including tourism, crime and safety, recycling and the economy.

From the discussions and a voting process the following priority themes were developed:

1. Support for older people (53 votes)
2. Public transport and accessibility (52 votes)
3. Clean streets and environment (41 votes)
4. = Job prospects and training (28 votes), = Support for the community and voluntary sector (28 votes), = Access to Broadband (28 votes)
7. Play facilities and leisure (22 votes)
8. Affordable decent housing (18 votes)
9. Activities for young people (16 votes)
10. Working with the travelling communities (15 votes)

With regards to the AAP board, over 50 expressions of interest to become a public representative on the Board have been received to date (the board is made up of seven public representatives, seven elected members and seven representatives from partner organisations).

Next Steps – the next step will be for a panel to select members for the AAP's board. The panel to select members for the Public representatives on the board will be made up of elected vice chairs from both the public sector partners and elected councillors, alongside a representative from the local Council for Voluntary Services (CVS) organisation and the AAP coordinator (an employee of Durham County Council). The selection process will happen between now and the end of June. The first meeting of the Teesdale Action Partnership board will take place mid June (date and venue to be confirmed).

Charity Commission Threshold Changes: Accounting and Reporting

In September last year the Government agreed to make a number of changes to the financial thresholds in the Charities Acts following a public consultation. These changes will, as planned, take effect from 1 April 2009. The changes to accounting and reporting thresholds are:

- the threshold for requiring accounts to be externally examined is raised from £10,000 to £25,000,
- the threshold for the preparation by non-company charities of accruals accounts is raised from £100,000 to £250,000
- the assets element of the audit threshold is raised from £2.8 million to £3.26 million and the lower income trigger for this is raised from £100,000 to £250,000, and
- the threshold for registered charities to submit their annual accounts and Trustees Annual Reports to the Commission is raised from £10,000 to £25,000

Police and Communities Together (PACT Meetings)

PACT meetings stand for Police and Communities Together and have been designed to identify and address community needs. Residents can raise matters which are clearly having effect on their neighbourhood. Such issues will be discussed at the PACT meetings and if appropriate formulated as a local priority. Priorities will be very time, location or incident specific and of a low level e.g. parking problems, occurrence of anti social behaviour, graffiti. During the four week period the police, and if required other agencies will focus on the problem and report back at the next meeting. The concept of these meetings is in line with the new South Durham policing Pledge which is aimed at local police, partners and the community working together to tackle issues of concern. Where possible they will look to include residents in the actual solutions.

There are four PACT areas in Teesdale:

- **The Dales:** covers Middleton in Teesdale, Eggleston, Mickleton, Romaldkirk, Cotherstone, Lartington and The Upper Dales area.
- **South Teesdale:** covers Barningham, Greta Bridge, Bowes, Ovington, Boldron, Hutton Magna Whorlton, Westwick and the A66 area.
- **Barnard Castle town:** covers the town, Stainton Grove and Startforth.
- **Gaunless Valley and East Teesdale:** covers Cockfield, Staindrop, Gainford, Woodland, Copley, Winston, Butterknowle and areas in East Teesdale.

Advance Notice – National Minimum Wage increase from October 2009

The Government have announced that the UK National Minimum Wage will rise by 7p to £5.80 per hour from October 2009 for adult workers. In addition, the rate for 18 – 21 year olds will increase by 6p an hour to £4.83 and for 16 and 17 year olds by 4p an hour to £3.57.

TVHC Criminal Record Bureau Checks Service

Teesdale Village Halls Consortium is offering a Criminal Records Bureau check service to voluntary and community organisations in Teesdale. Helen Thistlethwaite has been trained as an appointed person to assist those wanting to apply to have a CRB check carried out. People who work unsupervised with children or vulnerable adults should have a CRB check carried out. TVHC can assist with completing a disclosure application form and carry out a check on the required identification documents.

The Consortium is offering this service in conjunction with CAVOS (Community and Voluntary Organisations Sedgefield) who are a registered body with the CRB. TVHC wants to provide this service locally to make the process as simple as possible for voluntary and community organisations in Teesdale.
