TVHC Training Project secures funding

Teesdale Village Halls Consortium has secured funding from the North Pennine Dales Leader programme towards a TVHC Training project that will run in the North Pennine Dales Leader area over the next two years.

The funding has allowed Teesdale Village Halls Consortium to become a Chartered Institute of Environmental Health registered training centre and over the next two years the Consortium will run a regular programme of courses in the following accredited qualifications:

- CIEH Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering
- CIEH Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work
- CIEH Level 2 Award in Health and Safety in the Workplace

Local tutors have been contracted by the Consortium to deliver the qualifications. The North Pennine Dales Leader area covers Teesdale, Weardale, and some areas of Derwentside and South Tynedale, and over the two years courses will be arranged in all of these areas.

The first programme of courses will take place in June and July as follows:

Monday 28 June **CIEH Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work** Winston Village Hall

Tuesday 6 July **CIEH Level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering** St Mary's Parish Hall, Barnard Castle

Thursday 15 July **CIEH Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work** Eggleston Village Hall

Monday 19 July **CIEH Level 2 Award in Health and Safety in the Workplace** Whorlton Village Hall

Places are subject to learners meeting eligibility criteria.

All courses run from 9.00am – 5.00pm and cost £50.00 per person which includes registration, certification, course book, lunch and refreshments.

TOPS Small Grant Fund

Priority will be given to those applications that cover the following identified issues: access to, and promotion of, services such as transport issues and activities for older people.

Grassroots Grants Funding Still Available – Don't Miss Out!

County Durham Community Foundation (formerly County Durham Foundation) have informed us there is still Grassroots Grants funding available for any halls or other community and voluntary groups who haven't accessed it yet. The purpose of this funding is to support small voluntary and community groups/organisations to develop their capacity and provide them with the ability to respond to their community's needs. The grants provided can support capital or revenue purposes; the minimum grant that can be applied for is £250.00, the maximum is £5000.00.

The main eligibility criteria for the fund are your group should have been working in the community for longer than 12 months and your group should have an average annual turnover of less than £30,000 You can download or fill in the Expression of Interest form at

Over the past few years, Durham Rural Community Council has organised the Calor County Durham Village of the Year competition in this area. This year, Calor have decided to support communities by concentrating their efforts to tackle rural fuel poverty, therefore their competition will not be taking place. The good news is that Durham Rural Community Council has decided to stage its own competition with even bigger prizes!! The new competition is modelled on the original tried and tested scheme utilising the same objectives. The entry form asks questions about activities and initiatives across four areas: community, business, sustainability and communications. Durham Rural Community Council are providing two prizes of £1,000 for the winner and £200 for the runner up.

Entry Conditions: The judges are looking for: "Well balanced, pro-active, caring communities which, irrespective of size, are making the best of local opportunities in order to enhance and sustain a better quality of life for all inhabitants. The population of competing communities cannot exceed 5,000. The closing date for entries is 6th July 2010, with judging taking place between 27th and 31st July 2010. The winners will be announced on 14th October 2010 at Durham Rural Community Council's Annual General Meeting.

Recycling Project Goes Mobile

Two Teesdale organisations have joined forces to reduce landfill and help combat polio.

Teesdale Conservation Volunteers has agreed to collect used mobile phones for recycling on behalf of Barnard Castle Rotary Club which is collecting old phones as part of a global fundraising campaign to eradicate polio.

One of the practical arms of Teesdale Conservation Volunteers, known as Rotters, has just started daily collections of green garden waste to turn into compost. This season, however, local residents can now hand over their used mobile phones for collection too. People are asked to make it easy for the Rotters collectors by simply putting their phones into a plastic bag and tying it to the handle of the Rotters green garden waste bag.

The Rotary Club in Barnard Castle has already raised more than £600. It works in partnership with Envirofone Ltd. sending them to their recycling centre in Macclesfield.

Public Liability Insurance for Small Groups

All groups, however small, should consider taking out Public Liability insurance. These days, fuelled by the TV adverts for lawyers and claims handling companies, there is an ever increasing prevalence to making claims. For example, if at a meeting of a group, someone spills a cup of tea on the floor, and someone else slips on it and hurts themselves, either the person who spilt the tea, or the group as a whole, could be sued for compensation. Public liability insurance would cover that risk.

I know of a case a few years ago where an elderly lady tripped and broke her hip. The cost of that claim was £23,000 plus legal and other costs. Fortunately the group concerned had public liability insurance which took care of everything.

In the event of someone making a claim, a lawyer acting for that person will bring everyone he thinks may possibly be held liable, into the action, and every one of those people or organisations, even though they may ultimately be held to not be at fault, will need legal representation to act on their behalf. Public liability insurance would provide that.

It is not enough for a group to assume that it is covered by the insurance of say a village hall or community centre. It would have to be able to demonstrate that it is controlled by the management committee of that organisation. If it has its own constitution, or a separate bank account it is unlikely to be able to do so, in which case it would need to take out public liability insurance in its own name if it wanted protection.

I am in discussion with an insurer about the possibility of arranging insurance for small groups which do not own or occupy their own premises, at a premium I hope will be in the £50.00 - £60.00 per year range. Before anything can be finalised I need to be able to give the insurer an idea of the number of groups which would be interested.

Please let me know of any groups interested so that I can take the matter further.
